<i>Phrases for forgetting</i>	<i>Phrases for remembering</i>	<i>Phrases for reminding/remembering</i>
I don't/can't remember.	If I remember it correctly... (You're not 100% sure what you remember is correct)	Please remember to.../don't forget to...
I don't/can't recall.	As far as I can recall... (You're not 100% sure what you remember is correct)	I'd like to remind you about/to...
It slipped my train of thought. (You forgot what you were thinking, right in the middle of thinking about it.)	I'll never forget... / I'll always remember... (You are sure what you remember is correct)	You haven't forgotten about/to ____, have you? (to check if someone has remembered or forgotten about something)
It's slipped my mind. (Slip one's mind means to forget something)	It's on the tip of my tongue. (You know something but you can't remember it at the moment)	Do you still remember...?
