1. really, very, quite - use this for a special event or opportunity.	-I'm very excited about working with him. -I'm quite excited about my new car!
2. (really) looking forward to something - When you are anticipating an event in the future.	-I'm really looking forward to taking some time off.
Expressing Enthusiasm for someone else	
3. (so, really, very) happy / excited / delighted for (you, him, her, them)	-I'm really delighted for you. Good luck! -She's so excited for her friends' wedding.
4. Congratulations! / Congratulations on the/your ... - Enthusiasm for special achievements	-Congratulations on your wedding!
5. That's great / fantastic / wonderful! - When someone shares their enthusiasm, they expect you to react to their good news.	-Wow, you bought a new car? That's great!

| 4. Full of the joys of spring | To be happy and full of energy. | He must have had some good news. He's full of the joys of spring today. |
| 5. Happy camper | Someone who is contented or satisfied with what is happening in their lives and has no complaints. | With his new job and his new car, he is a happy camper . |
