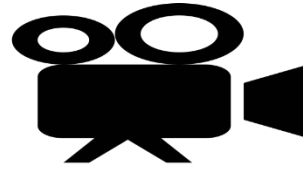

Idiomatic Expressions		
1. Steal the show	To attract the most attention or praise.	He brought his cute dog to the park and it immediately <i>stole the show</i> .
2. Be in the limelight	To be in the center of attention.	Celebrities who <i>in the limelight</i> always have a difficulty in keeping their privacy.
3. Crave the limelight	To want attention or be the center of attention.	Children usually <i>crave the limelight</i> , especially if they are around their parents.
4. Star-studded	Has a number of famous people, especially actors or sports players.	<i>Star-studded</i> parties always have tight securities to prevent commotion.
5. Run the show	To be in charge of a project or place. ; to be the leader, who is in control of a group of people doing something.	If you need help with the project, just ask him – he's <i>running the show</i> .
