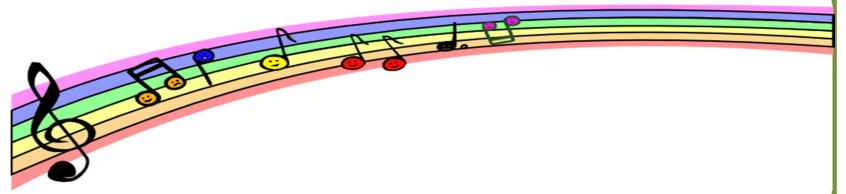

<i>Asking opinion</i>	<i>Giving opinion</i>	<i>Not having an opinion</i>
- What do you think about...?	- I think/believe...	- I couldn't say...
- How do you feel about...?	- Personally, I think/believe...	- I've never given it much thought.
- What's your opinion about...?	- In my opinion...	- I (really) don't know what to say.
- What are your thoughts about...?	- As for me...	- I really can't say.

Idiomatic Expressions		
1. Music to one's ears	Something that is pleasant or makes someone feel very happy to hear.	His compliments were <i>music to my ears</i> .
2. (Sound) Like a broken record	Used to describe someone who says the same thing again and again.	His father <i>sounds like a broken record</i> , always telling him to be careful when driving.
3. Ring a bell	If something sounds familiar, but you don't exactly remember.	John Bentley? The name <i>rings a bell</i> but I don't remember him.
4. Face the music	To accept or face punishment or consequences of one's actions.	She didn't manage to finish the job on time and had to <i>face the music</i> .
5. Toot/blow one's own horn	To boast or brag about oneself or your achievements especially in a way that shows (too much) pride.	We've had a very successful year, and I think we have the right to <i>blow our own horn</i> a little.
