2. Itchy feet	If someone has <i>itchy feet</i> , he likes to travel a lot or go somewhere else.	Thanks to low-cost airlines, people with <i>itchy feet</i> who couldn't afford air fares in the past can now travel.
3. Life in the fast lane	A way of living that is full of excitement, activity, and often danger.	Luxury cars and parties – he was living life in the fast lane.
4. One-track mind	Reference to a person who focuses on one subject or interest.	Bob has a <i>one-track mind</i> . He can only talk about sports.
5. Right up one's alley	Well suited to one's tastes, interests, or abilities.	The black dress is just <i>right up her</i> alley.
