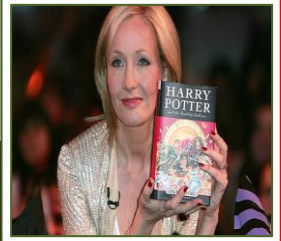

Idiomatic Expressions

Rags to riches	A situation in which a person rises from poverty to wealth	Some famous people nowadays have rags to riches stories.
The sky's the limit	There is nothing to prevent someone or something from being successful; no limit (to ambition, aspiration, expense etc.)	You can have anything you want----- the sky's the limit.
