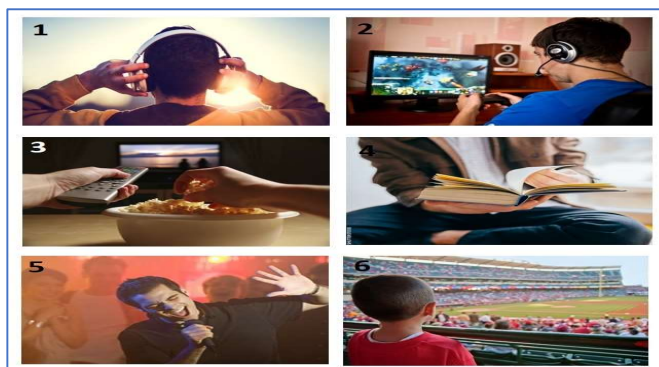

OTHER WORDS TO SAY "ENTERTAINING" AND "BORING" (Adjectives)

<i>Entertaining</i>	<i>Boring</i>
enjoyable – (of an event/activity) giving delight or pleasure amusing – causing laughter or giving entertainment fascinating – extremely interesting pleasurable – pleasant; enjoyable exciting – causing enthusiasm thrilling – extremely exciting lively – full of life and energy high-spirited – lively and cheerful delightful – very pleasant, enjoyable humorous – causing lighthearted laughter and amusement	uninteresting – not attracting interest or attention dull – not interesting or exciting humdrum – having no excitement, or new and different events lifeless – lacking energy or excitement stale – boring because it is always the same mind-numbing – so bad or boring that you are unable to think about it clearly uneventful – nothing interesting or surprising happens lackluster – lacking energy and effort vapid – dull and uninteresting dreary – dull and lifeless, likely to make someone sad

Expressions

1. Sing one's heart out	Sing loudly or with great enthusiasm	I was surprised when the shy little girl got up on stage and sang her heart out .
2. In one's element	In a place or situation which is familiar or enjoyable	Kate was in her element , arranging the flowers for the party.
3. Bring the house down	Perform or entertain successfully and make the audience laugh or applaud	The young comedian brought the house down with his jokes. We couldn't stop laughing.
4. For the fun of it	Doing something to amuse or entertain oneself and not for any more serious reason	We went on a picnic just for the fun of it .
5. Fever pitch	State of extreme excitement	The crowd's cheering reached a fever pitch when the band finally appeared on stage.
