- 1. Choice= an act of making decision

- 3. Option= one thing that can be chosen from a set of possibilities
- 4. Compromise = an agreement or settlement
- 5. Resolution= a firm decision to do or not to do something
- 6. Verdict= opinion or judgement given after considering the facts of a situation
- 7. Judgement= ability to make considered decisions
- 8. Conclusion= a judgement or decision reached by a reasoning

2. lesser of two evils	To opt for the less unpleasant of two poor options	Being late at work instead of not working at all was the lesser of two evils.			
3. sit on the fence	To stay neutral and not take sides in an argument; be undecided	When my parents argue, it is better for me to sit on the fence.			
4. cherry Pick	To choose something with great care and select only the best	Impressive and qualified applicants are <b>cherry-picked</b> by the HR department.			
5. in two minds	To have a difficulty to decide what to do	I'm in <b>two minds</b> about where to work.
