6. snore = breathe with a snorting or grunting sound while asleep
7. somnambulist= someone who walks about in their sleep; sleepwalker
8. vague= unclear

2. asleep at the wheel	Not attentive or alert	James wasn't able to recall the lesson because he was asleep at the wheel .
3. cat nap	A short sleep during the day	Julie takes a cat nap every afternoon.
4. sleep like a log	To sleep deeply or soundly	After his long road trip, Shon slept like a log .
5. broken dream	Dreams, plans, or goals that didn't come true	Winning the basketball tournament is the team's broken dream .
