#### **Exercise B**

#### **Grammar input**

Using "suggest", "recommend" and "advise" in a sentence.

Ex. I <u>suggest</u> we **make** it an evening event and combine it with entertainment.

I also <u>recommend</u> we **invite** clients with their spouses.

**Pattern:** verb of suggestion + that (optional) + subject + base verb

#### **Examples:**

- 1. My friend <u>recommended</u> (that) *he* **take** a taxi home from the party.
- 2. The sales clerk <u>suggested</u> (that) *she* **put** the dress on hold
- 3. She is advising (that) we finish our project today.
