Steve: Yes, they can. They might have to try and be a little more *outspoken* and not worry so much about group *mentality*.

Mr. Ito: I think many Japanese would like the chance to contribute more to their companies and not have to worry so much about their level in the company. Many of the younger generation are more interested in "pay for performance" opportunities.
