Language Point

Casual

Look what the wind blew in!	- Look who's here! - Look what the cat dragged in!	
My turn to buy the beers.	- I'll treat you. - It's on me.	
What do you prefer?	- What would you like? - Any preference?	

Formal

Nice to see you again, Simon.	- Good/Glad/Happy to see you again. - What a nice surprise!	
Please join me.	- Why don't you join me? - Would you like to join me?	
That's very kind.	- That's very thoughtful of you. - That's very sweet of you.

Simon: That would be nice. Thank you very much.

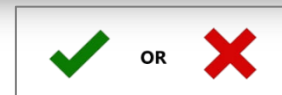
